

Eastern Ontario Crop Conference 2014 – February 20th



The Eastern Ontario Crop Conference is a cooperative effort between the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food/Ministry of Rural Affairs and the Eastern Ontario Crop Advisory Committee. This annual conference was held the third week of February at the Kemptville Campus, University of Guelph.
